Barcarena residents complete Port Logistics course

Artemyn celebrated the graduation of 20 residents from six communities surrounding Vila do Conde, close to Artemyn kaolin industrial facility in Barcarena, Brazil, who completed the Port Logistics course. The training took place in October and was delivered in partnership with SENAI (National Service for Industrial Training). Classes were held at Espaço Artemyn in Barcarena. The idea was straightforward: to offer practical training focused on the day-to-day activities of the port sector, helping to open pathways to new job opportunities. To conclude the training, the students organized the workshop "Port Management in Practice." It was a moment to demonstrate,

in practice, everything they had learned, through simulations of situations and challenges that occur in real port operations. With initiatives like this, the goal is to continue generating new employment opportunities aimed at the development of neighboring communities.

Children discover the world of mining through play

Artemyn organized a very special Children's Day celebration in Barcarena, Brazil, in October this year, with 58 students from the 2nd to the 5th grade who participated in the Academic Support Program at Espaço Artemyn. With the theme "Children in Mining: Learning and Playing," the proposal was to combine fun with learning, showing children how the company operates and the opportunities. In a light and relaxed way, children learned about different mining professions during the "Conversation with a Professional" session. The activity was conducted by 14 volunteer employees from the Environmental, Health, Safety, and Engineering departments, using a highly interactive dynamic. The program included a guided tour, the "crazy backpack" parade, and gift distribution. One of the most memorable moments was the video "Me in the Future," which used artificial intelligence to show the children in their dream professions. The initiative was part of Artemyn's Welcome Community Program.

Seeing up close how Artemyn operates was a special experience for residents and students from neighboring communities of Artemyn industrial facility. In October, a guided visit to the company allowed participants to learn firsthand about workspaces, daily activities, and the people who make the company happen.

During the visit, students spoke with Artemyn's Port Logistics

Supervisor, Francivaldo Ferreira, who shared a bit about his story and his daily work routine. For him, the meeting had a very special meaning.

"It was very rewarding to welcome the students and see their interest. This gave me even more pride in being part of a company that values and connects with the community," he said. The activity is part of the "Welcome,

Community" program, which seeks to encourage personal and professional development through education and the exchange of experiences. In addition to showing what work at the company is like, the visit helped bring people closer together, spark dreams, and show that when company and community move forward together, new opportunities and pathways for the future emerge.

Tutoring classe helps children from the Acuí Community learn more

The Tutoring Classes Program of the Acuí Community, also close to Artemyn kaolin industrial facility in Barcarena, Brazil, is an initiative that supports the learning of children from the 1st to the 5th grade of elementary school. The project, expanded to serve the locality, currently supports 30 children, organized into groups with students of different ages and learning levels, allowing closer follow-up for each child. In the program, children receive help with school activities, clarify doubts, and learn at their own pace. With the support of the teacher and assistants, the space becomes welcoming and encourages participation, confidence, and interest in studies. In addition to supporting education, the project also values the community



itself, through the hiring of local professionals to work in the activities. The initiative is part of Artemyn's actions and reinforces the commitment to the educational and social development of surrounding communities, helping to build more opportunities for children and for the future of the community.

"I have two children in the academic support program. One of them had a lot of difficulty with reading and writing, but today is doing much better." Jessica dos Santos.

Dialogue brings Artemyn closer to communities



The Community Dialogue is a space created by Artemyn to listen, converse, and be closer to those who live in surrounding communities of kaolin operations in Brazil. In 2025, meetings were held with residents of Canaã, Curuperé, Ilha São João, Vila do Conde, Bairro Industrial, and Acuí, in Barcarena municipality. During these conversations, the community and the company exchange information and clarify doubts on everyday topics such as the environment, job opportunities, education, and coexistence with the company. Based on these dialogues, important actions have already been implemented, such as medical eye exams with free distribution of eyeglasses and the issuance of ID cards for approximately 100 residents. The participation of community leaders, associations, and residents is essential to ensure that actions reach those who need them most.

Artemyn Global Action brings health and citizenship closer to communities

In Barcarena and Ipixuna do Pará, Brazil, many residents were able to take care of their health, resolve pending issues, and receive important guidance without leaving their own communities. All of this took place during another edition of Artemyn Global Action. The initiative provided various free services with the support of volunteers and local partners. Over three days of activities in November, more than 1,600 services were delivered. These included medical appointments, vaccinations, dental and ophthalmological care, as well as the issuance of documents



such as ID cards and CAF. Legal guidance, sports workshops, and personal care services were also offered, helping people access services that are not always easily available. The Global Action demonstrated the importance of staying close, listening to needs, and supporting the well-being of the communities of Barcarena and Ipixuna.

“Artemyn was the first company to do something like this in our community, showing that it cares about us,” said Jéssica Rodrigues dos Santos, a resident of the Acuí community and one of the beneficiaries of document issuance during the event.

Partnership brings Aquaponics to the Bacuri and Fé em Deus communities

If you live in the Bacuri community, in Ipixuna do Pará, Brazil, you can celebrate: new developments are on the way. Soon, the community will receive an initiative that brings together environmental care, learning, and food production. This is the Aquaponics Project, which will be implemented at Nossa Senhora do Bacuri School in partnership with the Municipal Department of Education of Ipixuna do Pará. The proposal is to support family farming in a simple, sustainable way that is connected to the local reality. Aquaponics is a system that combines fish farming with the cultivation of vegetables and plant seedlings. Everything takes place in the same space: the water used by the fish helps nourish the plants, and the plants help keep the water cleaner. In this way, food can be produced responsibly, making better use of natural resources and saving water. The project stems from a partnership between Artemyn, the Federal Rural University of the Amazon (UFRA), and the Institute for Amazon Sustainability with Science and Innovation (Isaci). The objective is to integrate theory and practice within the school environment, strengthen environmental education, and contribute to food security.



All production will be used by the school itself, supporting the daily routine of students and the school community. In addition to the school unit, the initiative is also reaching the Fé em Deus community, with the aim of supporting local income generation processes.

BENEFITS OF THE AQUAPONICS PROJECT

The Aquaponics Project makes it possible to produce fish and vegetables in the same space, with water savings and respect for the environment. In addition to ensuring food for the school, it helps students learn through hands-on experience and strengthens food security within the community.



The School has high expectations regarding the implementation of the Project. As the manager of the school unit, I understand this project as a concrete opportunity to strengthen pedagogical practices. The aquaponics proposal represents an innovative strategy that will enable students to experience, in practice, content related to Natural Sciences, Mathematics, Geography, and Environmental Education. Through observation, daily care, and active participation in the fish and vegetable production system, students will develop skills such as responsibility, autonomy, teamwork, and socio-environmental awareness. Improvements on 40 km of roads make daily life easier for communities



Those traveling along the roads between Tomé-Açu and the ARCC mine have likely already noticed: access routes are now better and safer. A total of 40 kilometers of roads have been restored, bringing greater peace of mind to those who travel daily through the region's communities.

The improvements support the mobility of residents and workers, facilitate access to public services, and make routes safer for school buses, especially benefiting children and young people who rely on these roads to reach school.

The initiative was carried out in partnership with the municipal governments of Ipixuna do Pará and Tomé-Açu, with support from Artemyn, and aims to improve circulation and mobility within communities, contributing to faster and safer daily commuting.



Playing, learning, and caring for the future on Children's Day

In celebration of Children's Day, Artemyn promoted a special activity for children from communities surrounding the ARCC Mine. The initiative took place in all communities within the direct impact area and combined fun with learning.

In addition to the distribution of more than 250 toys, children participated in educational activities focused on Environmental Education. In a light and interactive way, they learned about selective waste collection, territorial awareness, and environmental care, reinforcing important values from an early age.

Patrícia Cunha, a resident of the Cajueiro community, made a point of bringing her daughters and nieces to the event. "I thought the initiative was very good. All the children loved it; it was wonderful," highlights Patrícia.



Residents of Ipixuna do Pará participate in nursery worker training course

At the end of October, residents of the Fé em Deus community in Ipixuna do Pará, Brazil, took part in the Nursery Worker and Seedling Production course. The training brought together 17 people from 12 families supported by Artemyn through the Income Generation Program, in partnership with SENAR. The course, which was also offered to the Deus por Nós community, received support from the Municipal Department of Agriculture of Ipixuna do Pará.

Participants attended practical classes on organic fertilization, seedling production, teamwork, and the construction of nurseries measuring 10 x 7 meters, with capacity for up to 5,000 seedlings. The course also covered agroecology, environmental awareness, and food security, in addition to the provision of personal protective equipment (PPE).

"I learned new things that will help me in my daily work," says Idenilson Santos, a community resident. According to instructor Arthur Pimentel, the initiative sought to expand opportunities for producers to transform their reality.



Workshop strengthens community leadership and transforms learning into action

Leading a community is not a simple task. It requires listening, dialogue, organization, and unity. With this in mind, Artemyn held the Leadership Workshop in October, an event aimed at supporting and strengthening those who already act or wish to act at the forefront of the Fé em Deus, Deus por Nós, Aparecida, Cajueiro, Santo Antônio, and Santa Maria do Bacuri communities, close to the kaolin mine.

The workshop was designed to help participants feel more confident and engaged in their daily activities, addressing topics such as community leadership, project organization, fundraising, communication with the community and institutions, as well as strategies to identify challenges and opportunities within each territory.

Throughout the meeting, participants exchanged experiences, shared knowledge, and learned practical tools that can be applied in everyday community life. The goal was to turn learning into action, strengthening local leadership and contributing to initiatives that originate within the communities themselves.

Global Action delivers more than 460 services in Ipixuna do Pará

Taking care of one's health, resolving pending issues, and receiving important guidance without leaving the community became a reality for hundreds of residents of communities located in Ipixuna do Pará, Brazil, during another edition of Artemyn's Global Action. The initiative brought free health and citizenship services to the Santa Maria do Bacuri, Aparecida, Cajueiro, Santo Antônio, Deus por Nós, and Fé em Deus communities, with support from volunteer employees and local partners.

Throughout the event, held in November, more than 500 services were provided, including medical consultations, vaccinations, dental and ophthalmological care, as well as the issuance of documents such as Identity Cards and the National Family Farming Registry (CAF). The program also included Environmental Education activities with the Sustainable Soap Project "Ecóleo," sports activities, and aesthetic care, expanding access to essential services.
